CA' DI TERRA VINEYARD



We began leasing this 4.3 hectare vineyard in 2010. It was planted in 1981, and is composed of two parcels both positioned about five hundred meters from la Tosa. The largest parcel, measuring almost ninety by one hundred, consists of 3 hectares with a GDC growing system on the flat area and a part with the Casara system in the sloping areas; the grapes are Barbera, Bonarda, Sauvignon, Malvasia di Candia Aromatica, Ortrugo and Trebbiano. The smaller parcel measures about a half hectare, and is used for Barbera and Bonarda grape vines using the Casara growing system.

At an altitude of 175-195 meters, the Ca' di Terra vineyard has a clay-like soil and an especially warm microclimate, which makes the grapes cultivated here ripen a bit earlier than those in our other vineyards. The poor soil means that the vine vegetation is very minimal and the grapes are quite small, and the aromas, thanks to the terrain and the climate, are more ripe and complex than average, specific to white grapes: with mineral – fruit notes, Sauvignon aromas, ripe citrus and crushed yellow flowers similar to Malvasia, and ripe fruits from Ortrugo and Trebbiano.

As regards the red grapes, the Barbera, in the central section of the vineyard and cultivated with the GDC growing system, has a very small, concentrated grape, while the Bonarda is expressive, with a balanced aroma.
